Landscape: representing a view of natural scenery (may include seascapes, snowscapes, lunar, sun shots, etc.

Nature: spiders, cocoon, nests, bees, butterflies, non-domestic birds, reptiles, bugs, non-domestic animals, etc.

Portrait: posed picture, usually of head and shoulders, no distracting scenery

Still Life: primarily inanimate objects (ex. vase of flowers, bowl of fruit, etc.)

Digital Editing: any subject, photo to showcase digital image manipulation.
